Important notices!

Please note the new restrictions placed by the **EU General Product Safety Regulations (GPSR)**, which came into effect on December 13th. **We can now only ship yarn products into the EU and Northern Ireland**, as these appear to be exempt from the regulations. Any other items in our catalogue cannot be shipped into the EU or Northern Ireland until further notice. We're hoping that we can find solutions, but please do bear these restrictions in mind until that happens.

If you are affected by this and are coming over to the UK for any reason, including courses at West Dean, the final weekend of Heallreaf 5, the BTG 20th Anniversary celebrations, or whatever, do get in touch

as we may be able to make alternative arrangements with you. Email Alison on enquiries@weaversbazaar.com to discuss options.

We're now able to take **payments by card over the phone!** Phone Alison on +44 7594 234499 to place your order, and make sure you have your card handy as well as your order list. Please only ring between 9:30am and 12:30pm, UK time, Monday to Friday – we don't work 24/7, despite doing our best to be helpful...!

And finally - a reminder that there's now a **5-year time limit on gift vouchers**. Any new vouchers will be issued with an expiry date. If you already have a voucher, check when it was issued, or contact us to check (we'll need the code as reference), as it will now expire 5 years from date of issue. The oldest vouchers only have until April 2025 to be used!

Warp yarn in balls – We have a supply of Liina 9 warp yarn in 25g balls. They will be going on our website shortly, priced £3.

Jamboree Bags – these will also be available again shortly. Priced by weight, they are a mix of colours, making the most of our ends of cones.

Beginners kits? – If you're just starting out, why not order one of the balls of warp yarn, a jamboree bag, and one of our adjustable frames? There are instructions on how to warp up on our website, and you can always ask us to make sure your jamboree bag has contrasting colours so you can see what you're doing as you learn all those new techniques. You just need a kitchen fork and some scissors, and you're all set!



As well as ordering online, there are regular pop-up shops at **West Dean College** alongside tapestry courses, with thanks to Margaret Jones for continuing to run these. Keep an eye on our [website](#) for dates. You can also collect additional items ordered online to save postage, and raid the Northern pop-up boxes if you visit us – liaise with [Alison](#) in advance if you would like to make use of this option. And those of you attending courses and workshops with [Caron Penney](#) and [Jane Brunning](#) will know that they continue to hold a supply of weaversbazaar yarns.

Heallreaf 5 is on until 6th April and will be followed by Tapestry Touring International's **Verve** exhibition and then **BTG's Northern Group** exhibition in the Autumn - all as part of their wider series of exhibitions.



But do also come to see Kate's solo exhibition, **One Shell**, running alongside the ArtyBird Fellowship exhibition, **Intertwined**, 16th July to 14th September.

As well as exhibitions, Farfield Mill also run a wide range of regular workshops, including tapestry and cloth weaving. See their [website](#) for details.

This venue is well worth a visit at any time! And remember, if you're visiting Farfield Mill, weaversbazaar is only just down the road...

Talking of [ArtyBird Carnforth](#), exciting things are happening! They are currently holding **monthly Zoom talks**, where Kate is interviewing their Fellowship students. They will be answering questions about Inspiration, approaching Design, the importance of their work for them, the benefits of collaborative creativity and how the Fellowship programme changed them personally. The talks are hosted via zoom and you can catch the first of the series, which was an interview with tapestry weaver Sue Turnbull, on our YouTube channel, along with previous talks: <https://www.youtube.com/@artybirdcarnforth>. The **next one is on 22nd March**. These talks are leading up to their Graduation Show, 'Intertwined', which will be on at **Farfield Mill, Sedbergh from the 16th July to the 14th September**.

Running alongside this exhibition, **Kate Horner** will be having her own exhibition 'One Shell'. It is an exciting exploration of

the work behind the work, underlining just how important Design is in developing your unique voice as a maker.

Best of all, all of this work can be explored by you in our **suite of Design for Textile Makers online courses**. So far we have Colour, Shape, Line & Texture. You can find out more here:

Murmuration Collaboration – a set of 12 shaped tapestries that have been woven by most of the weavers who took part in [Waterline](#), designed to capture the sense of movement in a murmuration of birds. The group have collaborated closely so that the tapestries flow together in shape, colour and, of course, the murmuration itself.

By the time you're reading this newsletter the tapestries will be at the [Scottish Ornithologist's Club at Aberlady](#), just outside Edinburgh, **26th February to 13th April** – still on as Heallreaf 5 closes! Showing alongside some of the Waterline tapestries and some wall mounted

sculptures, the exhibition is called 'Spectacles of Nature'.

The catalogue for the Murmuration project is just being finalised – details on how to order and the price will be available soon.

Further venues are being planned for Murmuration, including an intention to show this project in the States and Canada. You can find out more, including links to the various bits of social media, on the [Nearly Wild Weaving website](#).

The British Tapestry Group will be celebrating its 20th anniversary in 2025 and into 2026. There will be a national exhibition, **Picking Up the Thread: The Past, Present and Future of Tapestry** which will tour between a number of venues, starting at the [Gracefield Arts](#)

[Centre](#) in Dumfries on 16th August 2025. There will also be a **symposium and workshops** alongside the opening of the exhibition. Further details are on the BTG [website](#).

Entry to the juried exhibition is now open! Full and student members of BTG are eligible to submit up to 3 works, so if you are interested in taking part make sure your membership is up to date! The monthly eNews keeps members informed and exhibition details are available in the members area of the website. Members also get a 10% discount on most products with online orders at weaversbazaar...!

Excitingly, there will be two tapestry exhibitions on at Gracefield at that point in time! [Interconnections 5](#), a biennial group exhibition by Scottish and Irish weavers, will be on at the same time. Book your travel now!

Some of the BTG Regional Groups are also planning exhibitions during 2025 and 2026. The Eastern Region's exhibition, **'Fenlands'** will be at the [Courtyard Arts Gallery](#) in Hertford 4th – 29th March 2025. The Northern Group will have a touring exhibition, **Tapestry of the North: Our Textile Heritage**, starting at Farfield Mill in mid-September 2025 and moving on to Kirkleatham Museum near Redcar, and then the Bankfield Museum in Halifax, both during 2026.
