At weaversbazaar we continue to widen our pre-dyed range of colours. And a new tapestry book is available!





The first four courses are taught by Ros Bryant. They include all equipment, materials and refreshments. Individual tuition with Ros Bryant is also available by arrangement.

Fresh - discovering woven tapestry. May 14-18th 2012. Learn to warp up, sample and weave a first simple tapestry. See what can be done in this timeless and wonderfully expressive medium. £250 including a frame and pack of yarns.

A Feast of yarns. June 4-8th 2012 Suitable for intermediate or new weavers. Explore the tactile, physical and visual qualities of dozens of yarns, from linen to lurex, rayon to ramie, wool to wire. Interpret a design in contrasting yarns. £280 including a pack of 50 bobbins of yarn.

Weaving sea and shore -suitable for the adventurous tapestry weaver. August 6-10th 2012. Enjoy a week between shore and studio, observing the sea and rock formations from beach, cliff top and boat. Back in the studio students will translate this experience into the language of woven tapestry. £290 including trips out

Off the rails. August 27-31st 2012. Suitable for intermediate or new weavers. Combining free weaving techniques with classical flat weave. Make flowing lines of eccentric weave, sculpt surfaces using soumak, and knotting, alter sett and expose warps. £240

Landscape to Textiles. April 28-9th and May 5-6th at Northlight Studio. A two weekend course taught by Jan Hicks and Ros Bryant, mark making and design from the Orkney landscape, and interpretation in a choice of textile media. £150 (or £80 for a single weekend)

Taught by Joan Baxter: Colour workshop, 1/2nd September,2012. Run concurrently with Sand Journeys - an exhibition of work by weavers in Denmark and UK, Joan Baxter and Ros Bryant, resulting from a collaborative project undertaken during the winter of 2011-2012. £80
