Apple 3



We are now building up another of our lovely gradated ranges – this time it is Apple; a fresh, bright green. Apple 3, the mid colour, is now available in Fine (18/2). Two shades lighter and three shades darker will follow soon and all will then be dyed up in Medium 1 (9.5/2) and Heavy (5/2). Artist Profile: Louis le Brocquy



Described by the Irish Times, in 2006, as 'the elder statesman of Irish art', Louis le Brocquy died in 2012 at the age of 96. His artistic career spanned seventy years and was split between residences in his native Ireland, London and France. In 1952 he met Jean Lurçat and engaged with Lurçat's system of integrating the work of tapestry designer and weaver by preparing a number of flat gouache works into numbered cartoons which were then

woven by Tabard Frères & Soeurs into nine editions. Thereafter there were a number of occasions when le Brocquy worked with tapestry weavers with some stunning results. Weftfaced tapestry weaving courses. March & April. Sussex and London



Weftfaced have released details of two new course, led by master-weaver, Caron Penney. A four day workshop at West Dean College (6th – 9th March) and a six week course at Morley College, in

London (5th March – 30th April). This latter course is looking especially at how art work from other media has been interpreted into tapestry. 
Tapestry Weaving with Fiona Rutherford. August 2016. France
