At last...British Wool!

weaversbazaar introduces a 100% british worsted wool Jubilee Yarn!



For sometime we have been asked to provide a 100% british worsted yarn for weavers, dyers and other makers. The challenges faced by the British Wool Industry over the past five decades or so – the growth in popularity of synthetic fibres reducing wool production, the devastating outbreaks of foot and mouth and the increase in the demand for lamb to eat rather than to wear – have led to the once great British Wool Industry all but disappearing.

When weaversbazaar first started we looked hard to find yarns from UK fleeces and manufacturers but whilst our worsted yarns are supplied and dyed in the UK, we know both the fleeces are from New Zealand and the spinning is not done in the UK.

However, we have always supported the Campaign for Wool (see below) and finally we are delighted to be able to offer a good quality British yarn, sourced 100% from British Bluefaced Leicester fleece and milled here in the

The yarn is a 2/7nm weight and we are offering it in 110g undyed hanks at £7.90 each. It comes in a natural creamy white, ideal for dyeing using either natural or synthetic dyes stuffs.

As this is the time of the Jubilee celebrations we are calling this our **Jubilee Yarn** – it is a closely twisted , worsted spun yarn we hope you will enjoy..

Yarn Collections

Responding to your suggestions we have made some changes to our colour collections. Our **Mega Bags** (see right) now replicate the worsted wool sample cards giving 25g of each of the colours available in two selections.

The **Colour Collections** (see below) have been revised to bring together groups of yarns that are ideally suited for blending and shading. In 18/2 these allow mixed weft bundles to be used that subtly shift a woven area through different tones. In the 8/2 and 6/2 weights the Colour Collections enable blocks of nuanced colours changes to be woven. Each month over the next year we will feature
